


## **Christmas Program**

C's - Creation. As we head towards spring, they will be moving into the 2nd C - Corruption and discussing when sin entered the world.


The youth are also using this same curriculum.

## Gen Z and Gen Alpha

**Generation Z** was born between 1997 - 2010 (ages 13 - 26) and is the first fully digital generation. These teens and young adults do not know a world without instant access to the internet with its goodness and terrors.

BeReal was the top downloaded social networking app in 2022 on the Apple App Store. Never heard of it? You're not alone. BeReal was launched in 2020 but has recently become popular with Gen Z. However, these are still the top three social platforms among members of Gen Z, YouTube (95%), TikTok (67%), and Instagram (62%).

**Generation Alpha** includes all children born after 2010—the same year the iPad was born. Most of this demographic is under 12, but the oldest are becoming teens in 2023. This generation is growing up with personal devices. Even though they are too young to use them, they are already active on social media. According to a survey of parents, 54% use Snapchat, 44% use TikTok, and 23% use Instagram.

With these personal devices, these generations spend an average of 8 hours online each day and have access to materials we don't want them to have. Simply put, they are growing up more quickly than we (their parents) did.

The good news is that these generations are the most willing to listen to both sides of an argument before deciding on a topic. They are the most likely to accept others for who they are. They are also more willing to work to make a difference.

Can I encourage you to put a few rules into play for your family?

- Don't allow your teen to sleep with their phone.
   Have them shut off and stored in a different room so they can sleep better.
- Keep all computers and phone usage in public areas in your home.
- Don't allow phones at family meals.
- Allow them to use social media after the proper age and then follow your teens on their social media apps.
