#### Holy Communion

In the Bible, the Apostle Paul wrote: Let a person examine himself and so eat of the bread, and drink of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28). Before attending the Lord's Supper, ask yourself the following questions

- Do I believe that I am sinner, and am sorry for my sins? • (Prov. 28:13; Rom. 3:23; I John 1:8-9)
- Do I believe that Jesus Christ by his death, offers me forgiveness for all my sins? (Rom. 5:8; Col. 2:13; Heb. 9:28; 1 John 1:7)
- Do I believe that I receive the body and blood of Christ in . and with the bread and wine (not merely symbolically present)? (Mat. 26:26-28; 1 Cor. 10:16; 1 Cor. 11:24-25)
- Do I desire to turn from my sinful ways and live a God • pleasing life by the power of the Holy Spirit? (Is. 1:16; John 8:11; Rom. 6:12)

If you are unable to answer yes to these questions, please talk to the pastor or an elder before communing, as participating without a proper understanding of Holy Communion can be spiritually harmful (1 Cor. 11:27-29).

If you can answer yes to these questions, then come with a repentant heart and join us in the reception of the Lord's Supper. Adults and children not yet instructed about Holy Communion are invited to come forward to receive a blessing.

#### **Building Expansion Committee**

The Building Committee has convened regularly for over a year now. There have been countless meetings reviewing and organizing our congregational wants and needs. All based on the last survey results. Then the committee formulated those wants and needs into a search for the right firm to help us in the next step. That step is to get a variety of different building expansion plans for our church.

We are blessed with a very strong committee that has detailed experience in all aspects of city requirements, architectural planning, actual construction experience, and communication skills. So we have used those skills and are poised to interview three perspective architectural firms next week. From there, the building committee will choose the best firm that will help us develop and propose different building projects for our church.

Though we have been communicating as a group, the building committee has not had any information to share with the congregation up to this point. Not because of a lack of effort. But because there have been no decisions on any type of building change or money exchanges to speak of.

There will be plenty of time to still discuss wants and needs. The chosen architectural firm will help us in that process as well as an updated time line.

# Mission Updates

- ICA Food Shelf—Food insecurity continues to be an issue as ICA has witnessed a 30% increase in food shelf visits since 2022. Why? SNAP emergency benefits came to an end. For a family of 4, they suddenly found themselves facing a reduction of \$360 per month. Increased Social Security benefits inadvertently shifted many seniors into higher income brackets, reducing their SNAP benefits. Those over age 60 are now seeking food assistance. Eligibility for Medicaid was reinstated and suddenly individuals found themselves without health coverage.
- Voice of the Martyrs—While most Cubans are atheists and follow superstitious and spiritist practices, many Christians in Cuba are hungry to get Bibles. Many lives have been transformed through encounters with God's Word.
- Lutheran Bible Translators—Technology is essential for those translating the Bible, equipping them to work more efficiently and effectively, and allows for easier collaboration. Laptops, built in batteries and phones have become essential tools in building momentum, helping translators get projects up and running quickly, while improving the quality of translation and Scripture engagement materials.
- Trinity First Lutheran School—Trinity helps families experience growth and hope in Jesus. Two 7th graders will be baptized soon; Two 8th graders will soon be confirmed; 30% of students are receiving special one-on-one services; 37 students meet with a school counselor to create plans that are helping them with school and life find success and hope; Six Spanish speaking families received Bibles with extended teaching notes so their faith will flourish.
